

I know at times our day to day lives are so busy it is hard to slow down and appreciate the family unit. But when we reflect and listen to others we learn more and appreciate others more deeply. At the beginning of this school year our superintendent shared a concept on deep listening. Recently I read an article about listening that included the concept of listening for understanding. The article explains that listening for understanding is a deep and special process. Our students, families and staff need this. The article states;

"Somewhere in the process of listening a magical thing happens – you start *understanding*. Without asking questions, you suddenly find answers concerning yourself, life, love, the other person and many other sacred things. Listen as much as you can, do it for everyone who has something to tell you. Then, among their stories try to find the moral, the lessons that you wouldn't have had the chance to learn otherwise. And when you do, thank that person, send him your love, and help him in return. Because even if you don't realize it now, he has <u>left a mark</u> in your life. So, during the next small talk you have, try to stop thinking, eliminate shyness and all the barriers between you, close your mouth and just listen. Listen with all your mind and soul, understand the body language, try to hear what else he wants to say but doesn't yet have the courage to and let him know that you are trustworthy."

"There are many ways to increase your knowledge – by reading, doing, watching, being taught, failing, etc. – and listening is one of the best and easiest."

Mr. Blydenburgh's Class



In recent weeks, Mr. Blydenburgh's class has been focusing on E-waste and the effect it has on our environment. They were surprised to learn that many of their favorite possessions will eventually be a contribution to this problem. One exciting note our students discovered is that some people are working to help the problem by repurposing older electronics and making money while helping the environment.

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Mr. Keshock 's Class

The students of Mr. Keshock's class have been working hard this year. In August, all five students earned their green necklaces at the YMCA by passing their swimming test. The students also modeled safe, respectful, and responsible behavior while having fun at the pool. In October, the students decorated the class-room door for Red Ribbon Week. With the help of Ms. Kristel Stiegler, each student used their creativity to design their own spider and pumpkin to add to the decorations. 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


Ms. Mcpherson 's Class

For the last three years, our class has used the ClassDojo software program for classroom management/ PBS, parent communication, and portfolio management. The students have really developed a hands-on approach to their own work center rotation transitions. Mr. Matt and I are so thankful that each student monitors their own work and leisure time while earning Dojo points to boot!

The structured teach method has been a real blessing for us all. We say that, "We can all achieve success – 8 minutes at a time!" (Each rotation is about 8 minutes.) There is no arguing, fussing, or fighting about who does what next. There is only, "Ms. McPherson, may I reset the timer and give points?" We have hit major milestones with class celebrations to match reaching 2,000, 5,000 points, 10,000 points. It is taking less and less time to reach (once insurmountable) class goal. I am so proud of how well the systems support learning and good behavior choices.

The class has successfully completed the FSA Writing Prompt exercise. Each student has completed each phase of the "practice writing prompt." Part I – read, understand, and highlight significant information from each source. Part II – Plan the essay using information from each source and quotes. Part III – write the essay. Part IV – revise and edit the essay looking for spelling, punctuation, grammar, indenting for paragraphs, capitalization, and the use of their best handwriting. This was a huge and daunting undertaking. However, each student has said, "I didn't think I could do it. <u>But I did!</u>" Yes, we will celebrate this too!
