Ms. Green's Class

Our class has an amazing group of students and staff. The paraprofessionals rock (Mr. Tres and Ms. Ann) and are so kind and patient with the children. In our class we start the day off with breakfast and circle time. During circle time the students use pictures to describe what zone they are in and how they are feeling. In addition, we review our visual schedules for the day and refer back to those schedules throughout the school day. We then set the timer (6 min. increments) and begin our structured teach zones, where the students usually transition quite nicely (we are very proud). At 10:00 am we transition to specials, 10:45 back to class for more structured teaching zones. Our zones consist of; the paraprofessional table, 2 independent zones, computer zone and the teacher zone. In each zone the students are able to shine and receive lots of one on one instruction and also some down time. When the students are on task, they earn rewards and free time/choice in addition to tickets which they can use to buy choice items from our treasure box.

Welcome 2020! As we enter this new decade, I can't help but look back over my 22 years of teaching and wonder how I found myself in Room 152 of Crest School. I spent 17 years at Floral City Elementary before I chose to come to Crest 5 years ago. Since coming to Crest I have worked with all grade levels, multiple learning capabilities, wonderful families, and the most caring and dedicated staff. Everyday I see people go above and beyond in what they do for our most vulnerable and I am amazed. I've met with parents who have dedicated their lives to making sure their kiddos have all that they need. I am blessed. I just want to say thank you to all of you for what you do for our students.

In the Learning Pond this year we are always looking for ways for our students to communicate their wants and needs. 
