- 2. Be active in the School Advisory Council- our first meeting is Sept. 15 at 3:30 via Zoom. Please let us know if you would like an invite.
- 3. Visit the school website- it has lots of information to keep you informed of what is happening in the class-room https://crest.citrusschools.org/.
- 4. Support schoolwork expectations.
- 5. Please send your child to school ready to learn by making sure they are well-rested.
- 6. Teach them organization skills- how to use assignments books, calendars, folders, etc..
- 7. Teach them how to study- flashcards, breaking things down into smaller assignments, taking breaks.
- 8. Know the disciplinary policies for the school and make sure your child understands them as well.
- 9. Take attendance seriously- sick students should stay home, but they should be in school if your child is well.
- 10. Make time to talk about school. Taking time every day to ask your child about their day while driving in the car, eating meals, or before bed helps them to know you care about their education and them.
