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World History with Mr. Walker

In Mr. Walker's World History class, the students learned about MesoAmerica, featuring the Olmecs, Incas, Mayas and Aztecs. The students used string to make their own Quipu, a form of writing and record keeping. The students also learned about different types of pyramids and their meaning. They created their own pyramids out of clay. Most of the pyramids were built as a representative of one of their sacred "gods." The students were presented with "god" cards, which taught the roles the "gods" played on society. They were encouraged to build a society, fight off attack and trade to acquire what they need, using Pokemon as a model. Each society believed everything provided to them came from a specific "god," (For example, Opotchli, the god of hunting and fishing, who not only provided them with the materials to hunt and fish, but also the prey to catch). A lesson that provided great enjoyment was attempting to play the "ballgame." While several forms of the ballgame exist, we learned about one of the original forms, where the players had to "pass" a ball using only elbow, knee or hip and get their opponent to "miss" the pass. The pass must be within arm's length of the opponent. We closed the unit by sampling Aztec hot cocoa and a dish of Aztec black beans and rice, with pork and a side of tomatoes, peppers and onions. The students and staff ate a ton of it! We ate these items during a MesoAmerican party, that included Incan/Mayan/ Aztec music, outfits, art and film. The students also took a quiz and all passed with A's! It was a fantastic unit. They now look forward to what fun and food we'll have for the unit on Ancient Greece and Rome.
